

What is the Transitional Living Program?

Transitional Living provides participants with the opportunity to stabilize their families housing and develop the skills and resources needed to be able to support housing costs. Each TLP participant will reside in their own apartment which will be monitored regularly by the delegated case manager.

Through intense case management, individualized service plans are completed and assistance is provided to move towards self-sufficiency during the participants 18 months of subsidized housing. After the 18 months of housing is successfully completed, 6 months of follow-up services are provided in hopes of sustaining family self-sufficiency.

The Transitional Living Program calculates rent payments based on 30% of the gross household income. The payment does not take into account any bills that the participant currently has and is strictly based on the current income. The calculated rent payments include all utilities except telephone and cable. Your identified case manager will calculate all rent payments whenever the household income changes.

The participant will be responsible for securing the deposit required for initial movement into the housing unit. If the deposit amount is unaffordable, assistance may be available through various community partners, or it may be divided into monthly payments which will be added to the monthly rent calculation. The TLP participant and the case manager will determine what avenue will be most effective.

Who can participate?

All Transitional Living Program participants must be enrolled and active in the Teen Parent Connections Program before applying for TLP services. The participant must be able to prove homelessness with proper documentation. All TLP participants must be at least 18 years of age and not exceed the age of 21.

What is HUB Teen Parent Connections?

All parenting is a challenge. But teen parenting can be especially difficult. That's where HUB Teen Parent Connections can help. **HUB stands for "Helping Urban Beloit"** and it provides support services that assist Beloit-area pregnant and parenting teens in achieving greater family stability, stronger skills in daily living & parenting, and increased self-sufficiency today and into the future.

The TPC program is an individualized, case management-based program in which the case management services are provided in the home, office, or school setting. The TPC Program has three different program tiers, around which program services are delivered:

- **Student**—Currently enrolled in high school
- **Employment #1**—no high school diploma/equivalent degree
- **Employment #2**—obtained high school diploma or equivalent degree and/or higher education

Through the application and participant assessment process, each participant is assigned to a program tier based upon individual needs/achievements. While a participant in the program, the primary focus of program services will relate to establishing goals, accessing resources, and achieving consistent forward movement towards self-sufficiency.

Who can participate?

HUB Teen Parent Connections is open to any Beloit-area pregnant or parenting teen—male or female—between the ages of 13 and 21. There is no charge to participate in the program.
