

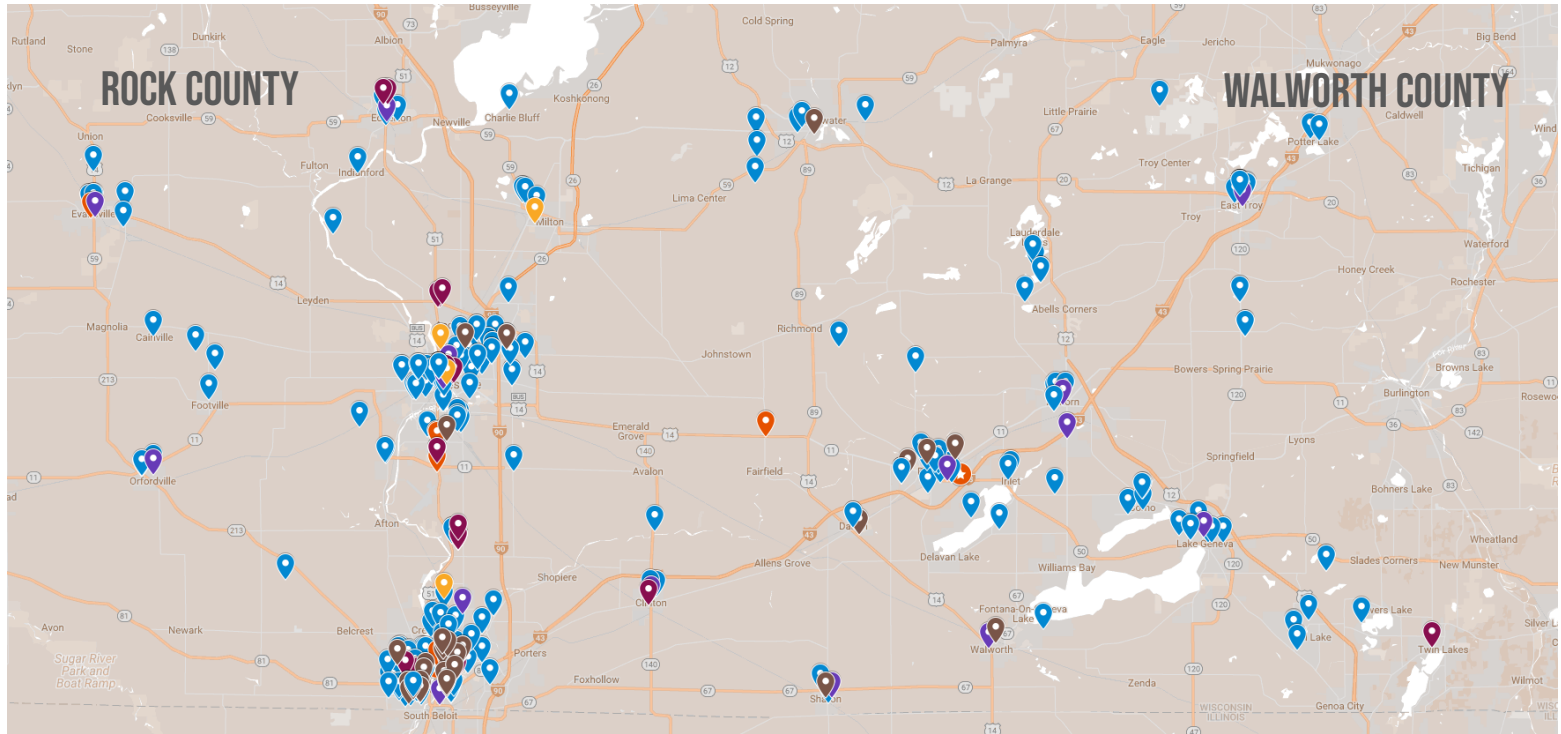

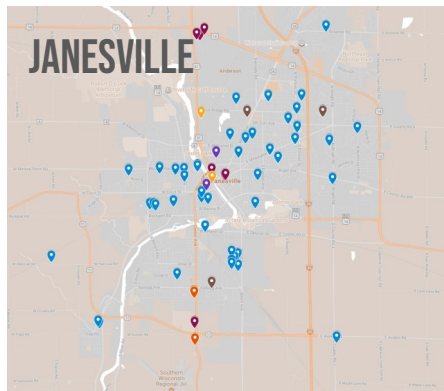
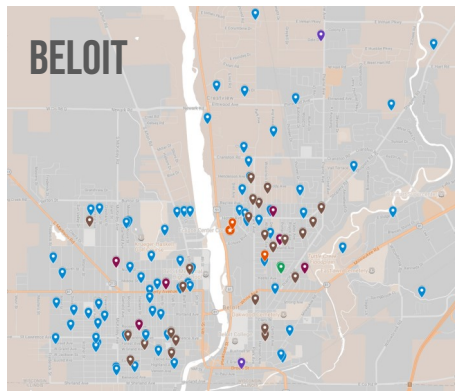


FIGHTING POVERTY IN OUR NEIGHBORHOODS

We served **5,153** people through our variety of anti-poverty programs.

1,305 patients visited First Choice Health Center, 426 of whom were new. **Fresh Start** students completed more than 12,300 hours of community service in Beloit. **Twin Oaks Shelter** provided refuge for 207 homeless people. **AWARE** reinstated **Snackpackers** and sent meals home each weekend with 81 low-income kids.

Weatherization helped 261 households become more energy-efficient and responded to 214 emergency furnace calls. **Community Action** reopened the **Merrill Community Center** for youth and senior programs. We trained more than 1,800 local professionals in workplace diversity and inclusion. We employed 107 workers in our two counties.
